WHY VOTE?

Election Day is your chance to have your voice heard on what issues are important to you and what kind of government you want to see in the City of Winnipeg.

This is your opportunity to elect or re-elect a Mayor and a city councillor for your ward. This is also your chance to elect a school trustee(s), depending on your school district.

AM I ELIGIBLE TO VOTE IN THE MUNICIPAL ELECTION?

In order to vote on October 26th, 2022, you must either be a:

RESIDENT VOTER: In order to qualify as a resident voter, a person must be:

- A Canadian citizen;
- At least 18 years of age on Election Day; and
- A resident of the local ward for at least six months on Election Day.

NON-RESIDENT VOTERS: In order to qualify as a non-resident voter, a person must be:

- A Canadian citizen;
- At least 18 years of age on Election Day; and
- A registered owner of land in the city for at least six months on Election Day.

Persons with no fixed address may vote in a city election. If the person has no ordinary or "fixed" residence in the local Winnipeg, they are deemed to reside at a shelter, hostel or other similar place that most frequently provides housing, food or other social services.

WHAT I.D. DO I NEED TO VOTE?

To be able to vote in this upcoming election, you need to prove your identity and address:

You must show at least 1 piece of government-issued ID with your photo, name, and address (for example, your **driver's** licence or a government-issued ID) **OR**

Show two pieces of ID. Both pieces must have your name, and one must also have your address (for example, your Manitoba Health Card and a utility bill, like Hydro, cable, or phone)

Examples of ID with your name and/or address:

- Manitoba Health Services card
- Manitoba Blue Cross card
- blank personalized cheque
- credit card statement
- Old Age Pension/Security card
- Income Tax Assessment statement
- utility bill
- passport
- birth certificate

WHERE DO I VOTE?

- Voting places (sometimes called polls) are open from 8:00AM to 8:00PM on October 26
- Your voting place is within a few blocks of your home, often at a local church or school
- A **Voter's** Notice will be mailed to your address in early October 2022
- Your **Voter's** Notice will include the place where you will vote

CAN I VOTE BEFORE OCTOBER 26?

You can vote ahead of time from Monday, October 3 to Friday, October 21, 2022. Advance Voting will be at City Hall (Council Building, 510 Main Street).

WHAT IS THE CITY GOVERNMENT RESPONSIBLE FOR?

- Road Maintenance
- Garbage Pick-Up
- Public Transit
- Policing & Emergency Services
- Libraries
- Land Use Planning
- Parks and Recreational Activities
- Animal Control

WHAT DOES A MAYOR DO?

As the head of the municipal government, the Mayor represents the City of Winnipeg at public events, meetings, ceremonies, and other functions. The Mayor is the Chairperson of and has the power to appoint city councillors to the Executive Policy Committee. This Committee sets the policy direction of City Council through recommendations on priority areas, plans, policies, by-laws, budgets, and other city matters.

WHAT DOES A CITY COUNCILLOR DO?

Each city councillor represents a distinct community or ward within Winnipeg at City Council. Under the direction of the Executive Policy Committee, City Council makes decisions on whether to approve or reject resolutions and by-laws that determine how the City of Winnipeg operates on a day-to-day basis.

WHAT DOES A SCHOOL TRUSTEE DO?

School trustees help determine how a school division operates on a day-to-day basis through participation in school board and committee meetings.
