#### **CAN I VOTE BEFORE ELECTION DAY?**

Advanced voting at City Hall begins on Monday, Oct. 3, 2022. Community advanced voting will be open from Oct. 18-20, 2022 from 3:00pm to 8:00pm.

## WHAT IF I DON'T HAVE A PERMANENT ADDRESS?

You CAN still vote if you do not have a permanent address. The temporary place you are staying is considered your residence, so vote in the ward you currently live in.

You will be asked to take an oath stating the address of the shelter, hostel or institution that most frequently provides you with food and social services, and that you are elligible to vote. No ID required.

#### WHAT IDENTIFICATION WILL I NEED?

To vote, you need to prove your identity and address: Show one(1) piece of identification that includes your photo, name, and address (issued by a government agency).

#### OR

Show two(2) pieces of authorized identification that together provides evidence of your name and current address. Both IDs must have your name, one must have your current address. Examples include:

- voter's notice.
- Manitoba Blue Cross card.
- a utility bill,
- Canadian passport,
- Indian status card.
- band membership card.
- Métis card.
- a card issued by an Inuit local authority,
- a credit card statement, etc.

#### WHAT IF I AM NOT REGISTERED?

If you meet the voter eligibility criteria but you are not on the Voters List, you can go to your polling location on Election Day with your ID to register and vote at the same time.

## **VOTE BY MAIL**

Vote by mail applications may be submitted online, by mail, email, or in person until October 23, 2022 at 4:30pm. www.winnipeg.ca/clerks/election/election-2022/ registration/VoterApp/sealed-envelope-ballot





Election Day is your chance to have your voice heard on what issues are important to you. You can vote for Mayor, your Councillor and School Trustee.

Election Day is coming on Wednesday, October 26, 2022. Vote between 8:00 am and 8:00 pm.

WHERE?

Voting stations (also called polling stations) are open from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm on October 26. Your voting station is within a few blocks of your home, often at a church or school. To find out the location of your station call 311 or visit: Winnipeg.ca/election2018. You can also check out the ward maps on the SPCW website: spcw.mb.ca.

If you are on the voter registration list, you will be mailed a voter's notice. Bring this card with you as it will help the polling station be more efficient.

## **YOU CAN VOTE IF:**

- You are a Canadian Citizen; and
- 18 years of age or older (born before October 26, 2004); and
- a resident or property owner in the City of Winnipeg for a period of at least 6 months (since Apr. 26, 2022).

## IF YOU NEED AN ACCOMMODATION


Anyone needing special accommodations such as magnifiers, Braille and sign language interpretation can call to find out if your polling station is accessible.

# **HOW DO I MARK THE BALLOT?**

The ballot will have three categories:

- 1. Mayoral Candidates
- 2. City Councillors Candidates (by your electoral ward)
- 3. School Trustees Candidates (by your school division ward)


Just fill in the circles beside the candidates of your choice with the pen they give you.

You do not have to vote in every category. You have the right to decide to vote for only a mayor or only the Councillor for your ward or only the school Trustees for your school division, if that is what you want to do. Just fill in the circle beside the candidate you want to vote for and you can leave the other categories empty.

# **DID YOU KNOW?**

The mayor does more than just representing the city at public events and acting as its voice with other levels of government. In Winnipeg, the Mayor picks which councillors will sit on the Executive Policy Committee (EPC). The EPC then only needs to convince two other councillors to vote with them to have a majority on any given issue.





# WHY VOTE?

In the last election, only 42% of Winnipeggers came out to determine who runs this city of roughly 750,000 people.

#### **EVERY VOTE COUNTS!**

In 2018, Markus Chambers won the election by 564 votes, making St. Norbert-Seine River the closest running of all Winnipeg's 15 wards.
